Scout, Scout, Scout

We are seeing a lot of discussion about the need to really get out there and scout this season.

For example, on the corn front a wet spring caused a lot of late planting or replanting. Last season saw a lot of Northern Corn Leaf Blight (NCLB) and Grey Leaf Spot pressure, so there is a high likelihood of holdover inoculum. A relatively mild winter may have allowed a whole host of insects to survive as well. So, as we hit hot and muggy weather make sure you take the time to scout and get ahead of any insect infestations.

Similar opportunities for problems exist for soybeans and many other crops. So, scout, scout, scout. And if you do see problems, make sure you talk to us about how SoilBiotics products can help make your fungicide/insecticide applications more effective.
